

How to write a thesis - a step-by-step guide

All the rules and techniques for writing a thesis and dissertation that you will find here are my personal experience accumulated over the years. If you do it yourself, students have the opportunity to thoroughly study the topic and understand the issue. The whole process of writing a diploma I have divided into 5 stages in accordance with the generally accepted order of their performance:

The first stage answers the following questions:

4. How to make a competent plan for the thesis?
